The film Stax: Tellin' It Like It Was is a look at the Memphis-based Stax Record Company from its inception in the mid-1960s to its unfortunate demise in 1975. The video makes it clear that Memphis and the international music community lost a gem when Stax folded. Producer Lou Paris interviewed former Stax artists, staff, and members of the community to tell the story, and used archival pictures and video to illustrate it.
